Guest Speaker :

Dr. Richard Benson, Dean of The College of Engineering(COE), addressed the group and spoke of the changes that are being brought about in his College with the renovations and additional buildings being constructed. HE mentioned that Engineering would like a Signature building across the street from the Inn at Virginia Tech in B Lot. It would have a parking garage. Dr. Benson spoke of his interest in Land Grant Universities and his past experience with Xerox Co. in Rochester, NY and Penn State University, PA. He spoke of their strategic plan which includes no growth in undergrad students but expansion in the graduate program and research. The COE is increasingly involved with International studies and now requires all students to own a tablet computer and team work is used as a model of learning. The college is more than half way to their goal in the Capital Campaign.
