COIA has broad responsibilities for numerous efforts and centers across Virginia and the world. The charge to the COIA can be found on the www.outreach.vt.edu webpage under quicklinks.

On April 25, 2013, Dr. Guru Ghosh became the Vice President for Outreach and International Affairs. Dr. Ghosh previously served as the Associate Vice President for International Affairs.

Main topics of discussion during AY 2012-13 in the COIA were:

- revision of the University Alumni Outreach Award criteria and timing to increase participation.
- how to structure and encourage international experiences and collaborations for faculty and students.
- how to measure, and therefore define and encourage, "engagement" or "outreach" for (non-Extension) faculty.
