Staff Senate Committees

- Communications Committee Bruce Harper gave an overview of needs and possibilities. The
 committee needs a chair and members who can assist with the Benefits Fair and Staff
 Appreciation Day to staff an information table. Other needs are to create a Twitter feed if that
 might be useful and to revise and update the Staff Senate brochure.
- Policies and Issues LaTawnya Burleson -- The main focus of this committee is to read resolutions passed on through the governance system, respond, and pass on to the Staff Senate any that need discussion/vote due to impact on staff. There is a chair, so we just need members.
- <u>Elections and Nominations</u> Tasia Persson -- this committee runs elections for Staff Senate and seeks nominees to fill positions on Commissions and Committees in the governance system. The committee is always looking at ways to streamline the process. Sheree Montgomery will be the chair (sheree@vt.edu).
- <u>Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion ad hoc committee</u> -- Tasia Persson will be the interim chair of this Staff Senate committee and is looking for members. There are training modules available on these topics and the committee will be looking for more things to work on.
- <u>Child Care ad hoc committee</u> -- The Staff Senate will continue this internal committee, but it needs a chair. This will feed into the university child care committee.
- McComas Leadership Conference -- Jennifer Early will continue as chair -- Tamarah explained the background of this conference, which the committee sets the date for, lines up speakers, and works with Human Resources on funding and other issues. Last year it was all virtual; determine the best way to do it this year.
